IFBEC is a global platform initiated in 2007 promoting ethical initiatives within the Defence and AeroSpace sector. It is recognized as the sector's primary interface by all stakeholders worldwide. An annual high level forum is organized, gathering nearly 100 participants from US and EU companies as well as major international players from other parts of the world.

Since 2010, regular meetings have taken place alternatively in Europe and in the United States. Last year's meeting took place in Washington and this year the event will be held in Paris.

IFBEC is internationally recognized among major institutions: NATO Building Integrity Program, Collective Action Hub promoted by the G20, OECD... More than 30 companies are members of IFBEC.


